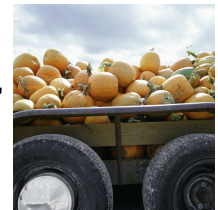
Learn about the Black community's contribution

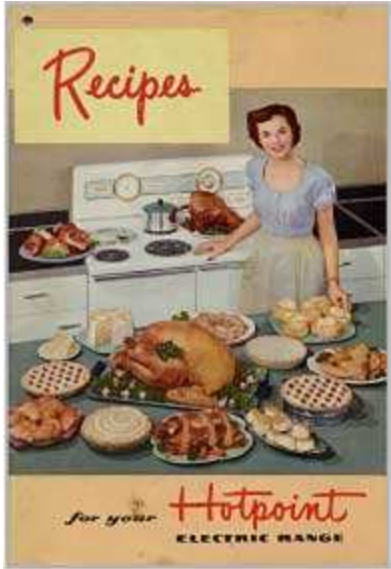
