

## New Passport Checklist

### You Must Apply in Person if One of the Following Apply:

- You are applying for your **first** U.S. passport
- You are **under the age of 16**
- Your previous U.S. Passport was issued when you were **under the age of 16**
- Your previous U.S. Passport was **lost, stolen, or damaged**
- Your previous U.S. Passport was issued **more than 15 years ago**
- Your name has changed since your U.S. Passport was issued and you are **unable to legally document your name change**

If your previous passport was issued less than 15 years ago, you may renew by mail with the DS-82.

### To Obtain a New Passport, You Will Need the Following Items:

- Completed Form DS-11, Application for a U.S. Passport**

#### Notes:

- **DO NOT SIGN THE FORM** until requested to do so by an authorized agent.
- **Form DS-11** must be completed in black ink or filled in online and printed out prior to the appointment. Forms are available at the Adult Services Desk and online at [travel.state.gov](http://travel.state.gov)

- Evidence of U.S. Citizenship (one of the following)**

- Previously issued, undamaged U.S. Passport
  - If renewing a passport for a minor, bring both the previous passport and copy of birth certificate
- Certified birth certificate issued by the city, county, or state
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad or Certification of Birth
- Naturalization Certificate
- Certificate of Citizenship

- Identification (one of the following)**

- Previously issued, undamaged U.S. Passport
- Valid Driver's License
- Current Government ID (city, state, or federal)
  - With a state ID, bring a secondary source of ID such as a social security card
- Current Military ID (military and dependents)

- One Passport Photo**

- In color, 2 x 2 inches in size
- Taken within the past 6 months, showing current appearance
- Full face, front view with a plain white or off-white background
- Taken in normal street attire
- NO GLASSES in photo

- Applicable Passport Fee**

- Separate payments must be made for the Passport Fee and the Execution Fee
- Forms of payment accepted for the Passport Fee:
  - Personal check, money orders, or bank drafts made payable to "Department of State"
- Forms of payment accepted for the Execution Fee:
  - Personal check, money orders, or bank drafts made payable to "Twinsburg Public Library"
  - Exact Cash is also accepted for the Execution Fee only
  - The Execution Fee must be paid separately from the Passport Fee.

## Mailing Fees

<b>Overnight from TPL to National Passport Processing (Payable to TPL, add to execution fee)</b>	\$24.70
<b>Overnight from National Passport Processing to Applicant (Payable to Dept. of State, add to check on application)</b>	\$15.89

Photo Fee at TPL - \$10 (note: it is not required to have your photo taken at TPL)

## Requirements for Birth Certificates

To be used as primary evidence of US citizenship for a passport application, certified copies of birth certificates must include the following information:

- Full name of the applicant
- Date of birth
- Place of birth
- Raised, embossed, impressed, or multicolored seal of the issuing authority
- Full names of the applicant's parents
- Registrar's signature
- The date the certificate was filed with the registrar's office (must be within one year of date of birth)

Birth certificates missing this information will not be acceptable as evidence of citizenship.
